Call for expression of interest for new foreign arrangements

The expression of interest process is open for schools interested in forming new sister school partnerships or varying existing partnerships with international counterparts. This is in line with Australia's foreign policy objectives under Australia's Foreign Relations (State and Territory Arrangements) Act 2020 (the Act). Under the Act, schools submit a proposal to the Australian Government Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade through the International Education Division, before negotiating and entering into written arrangements with foreign entities.

If your school is considering a new sister school partnership or want to vary an existing arrangement, please complete the School Foreign Arrangement Form and Sister School Memorandum of Understanding and email both documents to ied.stakeholder.engagement@education.vic.gov.au by 10 March 2023.

The fifth forum, held in November, brought together 923 Victorian and international students from 55 Victorian schools and 39 international schools across 6 Asia-Pacific countries. The sixth cohort will begin on 28 March to help students enhance their intercultural capability skills and explore how to be young active leaders and global citizens. Launch of the Emerging Leaders Forum Pilot Program 2023 (Years 5 – 8)

The Victorian Young Leaders: Emerging Leaders Forum is an exciting new program for Year 5 to Year 8 students. The program aims to enhance student leadership, voice, agency, intercultural understanding, and engagement with the Asia-Pacific region. The 2023 pilot program will be delivered online from 8 – 12 May to provide an opportunity for 60 Victorian students from various schools to engage with students online and explore the concepts of identity, culture, belonging, globalisation, and global citizenship. The delivery of the program will be facilitated by Asia Education Foundation at the University of Melbourne on behalf of the department.

Globally Engaged Learners Program: The Global Citizenship Student Ambassador Program (Years 5 – 6)

The Globally Engaged Learners (GELs) program funds a range of global learning and engagement activities that enable international or local student peer-to-peer collaboration and build students' global citizenship skills and capabilities.

This year, one of the activities delivered under the GELs banner is the Global Ambassador Program for students in Years 5 – 6. This one-year program builds empowered global citizens who learn about global citizenship core concepts and then use these skills to take action on a real issue in their school or school community. Students work as inclusive student leaders to design solutions, through consultation with their peers and school community, leveraging community partnerships to amplify their project impact and success.
